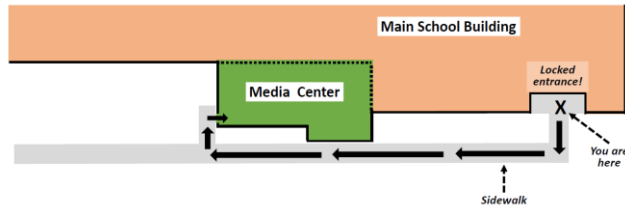


# My Current Signs

## PRECINCT 19-19 VOTERS

Vote in the school's Media Center.  
Follow the sidewalk and signs around to the left.



Hung on the school's main door to direct voters to the correct door for the voting enclosure. The sign is laminated.

Get in the line

per the **first letter**  
of your **last name**

Used to direct voters to the appropriate Registration Table "Wait Here" line.

## Ballot Table Waiting Area



Use only if another voter is being served;  
otherwise go directly to the Ballot Table

If you must wait, please stand behind the blue line

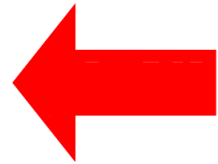
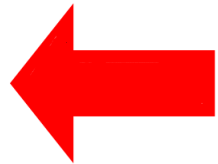
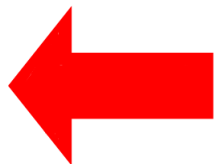
Placed beside the Ballot Table Wait Area, preferably on a sign stand.

Slide ballot into this slot



Placed on the Tabulator tray to cover a small slot, used only for narrow ExpressVote ballots. The arrow points to the larger slot, used for the wider, regular ballots.

CAST YOUR BALLOT



Hung on a chair at the turn in the path from the voting booths area to the Tabulator.

The Polls Are Now

**CLOSED**

Hung on the door to the voting enclosure at 7:30 P.M. The sign is laminated.

- Insert ballot in slot by arrows (ANY orientation works)
- Then **WAIT** until your ballot status is displayed:

⇒ "Your ballot has been counted." (good!)

or

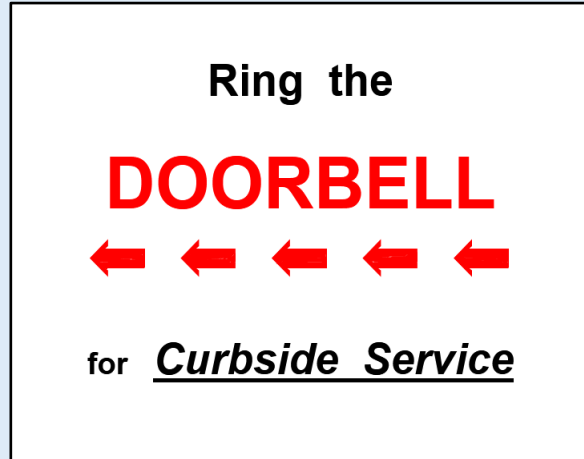
⇒ An error screen with actions you can take

Hung from the Tabulator lid.

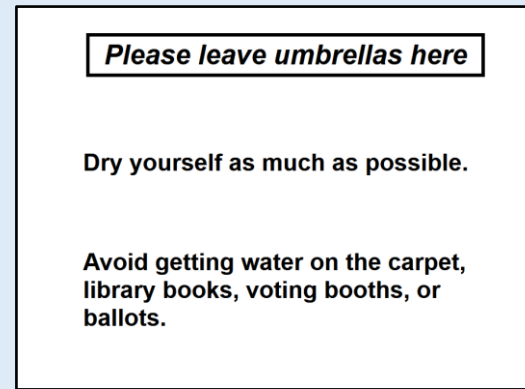
# My Current Signs



Placed on an A-frame to keep people from parking in a place for which we have no cone. The sign is laminated.



Placed on an A-frame across from the curbside stand. A BOE black-on-yellow arrow sign is hung below it. The sign is laminated.



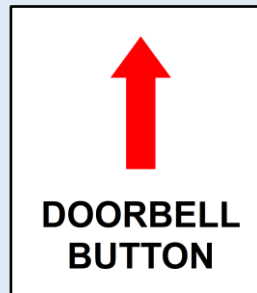
Placed by the Rain Table.



Used blue vinyl tape to underline the "NOT" on a large BOE H-frame sign.



Hung on the Chief Judge's car at the end of the curbside area. The sign is laminated.



Hung on the curbside stand, below the doorbell button. Now put in a Ziploc bag.



Used white vinyl tape to make arrowhead bigger on a BOE H-frame sign.



Hung by entrance to voting enclosure.

# My Current Signs



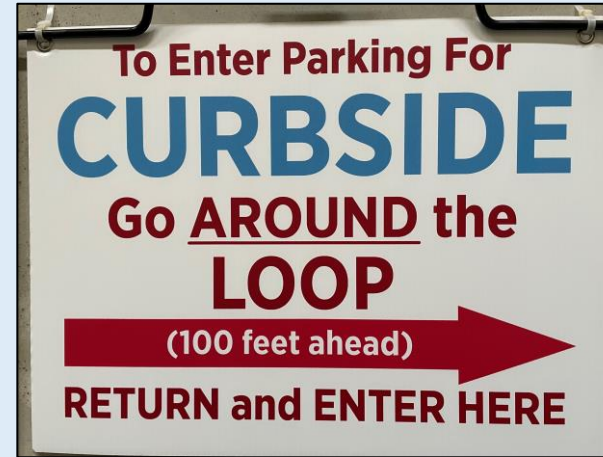
Paper "0.6 Miles" signs are taped on both sides of a standard BOE vinyl "Polling Place" sign to show the distance to the polling place on our long, winding road. There is a similar "0.3 Miles" sign.



Metal (24" x 24") "No Left Turn" (NLT) sign, used to tell drivers not to try to make a 180-degree turn into the curbside parking area entrance.

This sign is hung on an A-frame near the entrance to the curbside parking area. Also hung on this frame is a standard BOE "Curbside Voting" sign, facing in the opposite direction; I added a red arrow below it.

The A-frame is perpendicular to the traffic lanes beside the curbside parking area to make the NLT show what turn is not allowed.



Sign is hung on an A-frame and placed near the "No Left Turn" A-frame. This A-frame is oriented parallel to the traffic lanes beside the curbside parking area to make the sign easy to read from a car. This is a corrugated plastic sign and was supplied by the BOE.



Sign on a file jacket for placement over the top of a standard BOE sign stand. A duplicate of the sign is on the other side of the jacket. The red arrow points to the masking tape arrows on the floor. The stand is placed at the start of the path from the voting booths to the Tabulator.



Sign and rod hung on the school's carpool traffic cones, as shown in picture on the right.

Laminated arrow on back of BOE "Go AROUND the LOOP" A-frame sign. The arrow points to the curbside stand.



Laminated arrow on back of my "No Left Turn" metal sign, visible below the BOE "Curbside Voting" sign hung on the same A-frame. The arrow points to the entrance to the curbside voting area.

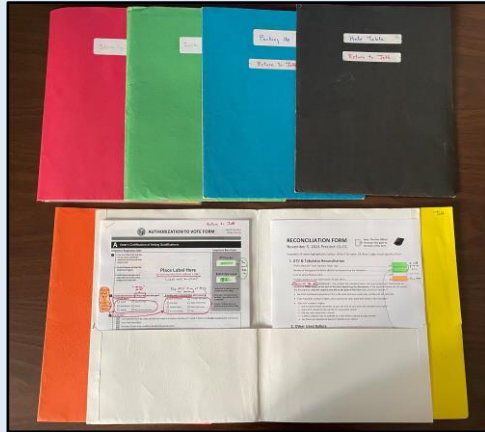


These two laminated signs are hung (stacked as shown) on some otherwise unused A-frame. The arrows point to the curbside stand.

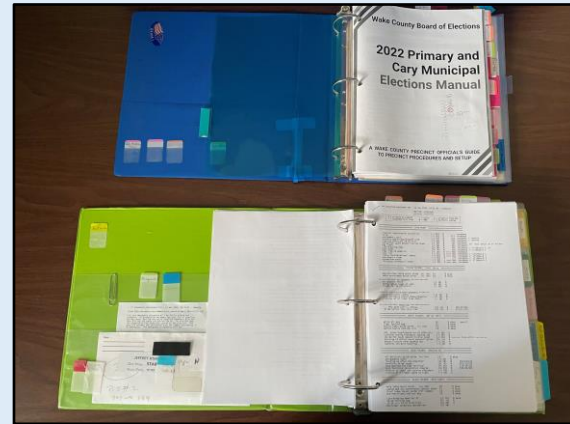


Laminated sign placed on back of Chief Judge's car to indicate it is parked legally at the end of the curbside area.

# Some Other Items



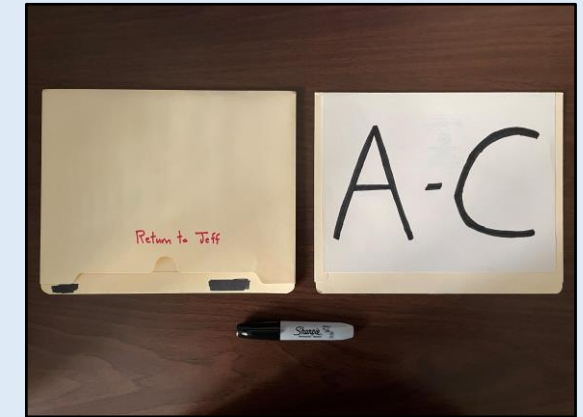
Pocket folders used to distribute items to various areas during Monday Setup.



Binders (notebooks) used for BOE documents and for my material.



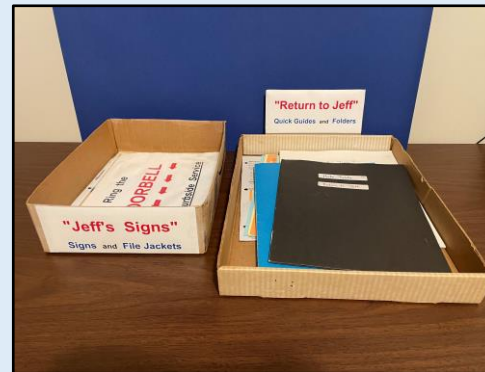
Clipboards and masking tape.



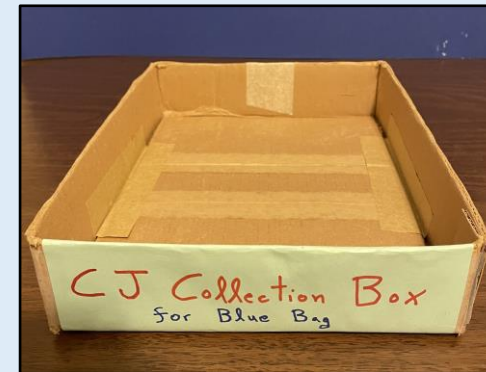

This allows much larger letters to be displayed. This is needed since the ends of the RT wait lines are far from the RT tables and the signs on those tables.
